

Republican Party of Sheboygan County
Executive Committee Minutes
Monday, October 8, 2018

Chairman Dennis Gasper called the meeting to order at 7:03 p.m. and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Those present were: Dennis Gasper, Darryl Carlson, Judy Gasper, Art DeJong, Carmen Dolson, Paul Gruber, Senator Devin LeMahieu, Rep. Tyler Vorpapel, and Greg Quella.

Secretary Judy Gasper distributed copies of the September meeting minutes, which had also been emailed to committee members. There being no additions or corrections, Darryl made a motion to accept the minutes as distributed, motion seconded by Carmen, motion carried.

In the absence of Treasurer Jan Vojta, Chairman Gasper presented the Treasurer's Report prepared by Jan. Total cash on hand is \$13,322.05. Darryl made a motion to file the Treasurer's Report for audit, motion seconded by Judy, motion carried.

Judy Gasper reported that the final total of 2018 memberships is 208. This was adjusted down from 210 reported in September, since it was decided to count any dues paid during or after the county fair as 2019 memberships. Paid memberships for 2019 are nineteen.

Communications chairman, Al Jante, was not present, but Darryl and Greg Quella reported that they are both posting on our Facebook page. They said there is a good amount of traffic there.

Our September Corn Roast was a success. About 85 people attended; we made a profit of \$550.00.

Darryl reported that about 60 people attended the 6th District brunch fundraiser at our headquarters for Glenn Grothman. About \$2,000.00 was raised.

A new two-year lease for our headquarters building was signed before tonight's meeting; the term is from December 1, 2018 through November 30, 2020. The rent and other terms will remain the same.

Chairman Gasper addressed the difficulty of finding things for our many volunteers to do. Most don't want to make phone calls or knock on doors. There will be GOTV calls made by willing callers.

Rep. Terry Katsma arrived.

There was discussion of the campaigns. Our legislators thought that Governor Walker and Leah Vukmir will stop at our location sometime before the election. Senator LeMahieu said he and his volunteers have knocked more than 25,000 doors and are on their second time around. He has radio ads on nine stations. Rep. Vorpapel sent out a mail piece and has two more ready to go. All legislators noted the presence of their opponents out and about. The outlook for the Assembly is that some seats thought to be at risk look safe now; some seats that looked safe now might be at risk.

Darryl stated that the election night party will be held at Pine Hills. Volunteers are invited for 8 p.m., others for 8:30 p.m.

The next Executive Committee meeting will be held on Monday, November 12th.

There being no further business, Darryl made a motion to adjourn, motion seconded by Paul, motion carried. The meeting was adjourned at 7:40 p.m.
